STIPULATION AND ORDER OF SUSPENSION

The Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (Commission) issued a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing on April 3, 2003, to Michael Eric McNeil, proposing to impose discipline under ORS 342.177. Mr. McNeil has requested a hearing. After a review of the matters alleged, Mr. McNeil and the Commission have agreed that their respective interests, together with the public interest, are best served by a stipulation to certain facts and the suspension of Mr. McNeil's license, followed by a period of probation.

In entering into this stipulation, Mr. McNeil waives his right to a hearing and understands that the Commission will suspend his teaching license for a period of 90 days. This stipulation and order are contingent upon approval by the full Commission. If the Commission does not approve this stipulation and proposed order, it is understood that any waiver of rights by Mr. McNeil is therefore revoked. It is further understood that the statements contained in this stipulation may not be used by either the Commission or Mr. McNeil for any reason if the Commission fails to approve this stipulation and proposed order.

STIPULATED FACTS

Mr. McNeil and the Commission stipulate as follows:

1. Mr. McNeil holds a Basic Teaching License with an endorsement in elementary education. The license is valid through November 12, 2005.

1 timely application for reinstatement under OAR 584-050-0015, Mr. McNeil's teaching license
2 shall be reinstated upon the condition that he successfully complete the anger management
3 program and comply with all other terms of his court-ordered probation.

4 Following reinstatement, Mr. McNeil shall be placed on probation from the date of
5 reinstatement for a period of one year.

6 Violation of any condition of probation may constitute an independent basis for the
7 Commission to impose discipline, up to and including revocation of Mr. McNeil's Oregon
8 Teaching License, subject to his right to a hearing on the issue of whether he violated probation.
