STIPULATION OF FACTS

1. The Commission issued a Basic Teaching license to Mr. Honjas on June 6, 1987.

2. On May 2, 1991, the Commission denied Mr. Honjas' application for renewal of licensure based upon false statement regarding a conviction for DUII. On July 26, 1991, the Commission entered into a settlement agreement with Mr. Honjas granting renewal of licensure and placing Mr. Honjas on probation for one year.

3. On January 2, 1992, the Commission received a report from Portland Public Schools indicating that Honjas was arrested in two separate alcohol related incidents involving inappropriate sexual behavior in the company of adults. Mr. Honjas was not criminally prosecuted in these incidents. The Commission charged Mr. Honjas with misconduct and sought to impose further discipline upon Mr. Honjas for violation of probation. On March 19, 1993, at Mr. Honjas' request, the Commission held a hearing in this matter. On April 7, 1993, the Commission adopted an Order placing Mr. Honjas on probation, with specific terms and conditions, for four years.

4. On December 2, 1993, the Commission issued a Notice of Proposed Termination of Probation and Revocation of Licensure based upon evidence that Mr. Honjas violated his probation by consuming alcohol and operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol. On February 3, 1994, the Commission adopted a Stipulation, Surrender of License and Order revoking the licensure of Mr. Honjas.

5. On January 28, 1999, Mr. Honjas applied to reinstate a revoked license. On March 15, 1999, the Commission notified Mr. Honjas of denial of his application for reinstatement based upon repeated criminal convictions involving alcohol. On September 20, 1999, at Mr. Honjas' request, the Commission held a hearing. On September 20, 1999, the Commission adopted an Order denying the application for reinstatement of a revoked license

1 6. On September 22, 2004, Mr. Honjas applied for reinstatement of a revoked license.

2 On January 13, 2005, the Commission reviewed the application materials Mr. Honjas submitted
3 in support of reinstatement. The Commission adopted a resolution approving restatement of
4 licensure for Mr. Honjas based upon convincing evidence of fitness to serve as an educator.

12 **CONCLUSION OF LAW**

14 qualifications required for reinstatement of his Oregon Teaching License pursuant to OAR 584-
15 050-0015(4).

2 **ORDER**

3 The Oregon Teaching License of Angelo James Honjas is hereby reinstated subject to
4 all standard terms and conditions.

5 Furthermore, the Commission imposes a two (2) year probation upon Mr. Honjas subject
6 to the following terms and conditions:

7 1. Mr. Honjas shall at his own initiative and expense, continue to obtain treatment for his
8 alcohol dependency as recommended by his alcohol treatment provider;

9 2. During the period of this probation, Mr. Honjas shall comply with the terms of his
10 aftercare plan and shall abstain from the consumption of alcohol;

11 3. During the period of his probation, Mr. Honjas shall submit to the Executive Director
12 of the Commission reports of his compliance with the treatment plan and this probation.

13 Mr. Honjas shall provide these reports every six (6) months during his probation, on or before:
14 September 11, 2005, March 11, 2006, September 11, 2006, and March 11, 2007;

15 4. Mr. Honjas shall report in writing within ten days to the Executive Director of the
16 Commission any arrest or citation for any felony, misdemeanor, major traffic violation; and

17 5. Mr. Honjas shall comply with all Standards for Competent and Ethical Performance of
18 Oregon Educators under Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 584, Division 020.

19 If Mr. Honjas does not comply with all terms and conditions of this probation, based on
20 the reports of his treatment provider or as otherwise determined by the Executive Director, he
21 shall be in violation of this probation. Violation of a term or condition of this probation may
22 constitute an independent basis for the Commission to impose discipline, up to and including
23 revocation of Mr. Honjas' licensure subject to Mr. Honjas' right to a hearing on the issue of
24 whether he violated probation.
