

1 2. On or about October 12, 2005, the Tigard Tualatin School District notified the
2 Commission that a District investigation uncovered allegations of inappropriate conduct by Mr.
3 Johnson.

4 3. Mr. Johnson was alleged to have allowed students to come to his house, on one
5 occasion, to help him wash his car. Such socializing outside of school hours and off school
6 grounds is not allowed by school district policy.

7 4. Mr. Johnson retired from his position at Tigard High School prior to the conclusion of
8 the District's investigation. Mr. Johnson contested the allegations levied against him.

9 5. Mr. Johnson was not interviewed by TSPC as part of this investigation.

20 authority to impose discipline in this matter is based upon ORS 342.175.
